

Daniel Fast Prayer Points

The focus of the Daniel Fast is **prayer**. Although you may be concerned about the food list, your priority on the fast should always be calling out to God on behalf of your own needs and the needs of others.

You should keep a journal or notebook so you can write down specific requests, how God answers them, and what the Lord does in your life on your 21-day journey. Also, use the following list of prayer points-one for each day of the fast-to make your prayer time more effective. Lastly, use the daily verses in your prayers by praying them aloud.

As you speak God's truth with faith and confidence, you'll be declaring supernatural power over people and circumstances, which will bring about changed hearts for eternity.

Day 1 – Pray for unbelievers to repent and be saved.

Jan.15

“Satan, who is the god of this world, has blinded the minds of those who don't believe. They are unable to see the glorious light of the Good News. They don't understand this message about the glory of Christ, who is the exact likeness of God”. (II Corinthians 4:4 NLT)

Day 2 – Pray for revival and a great awakening in the world.

Jan. 16

“If my people, who are called by my name, will humble themselves and pray and seek my face and turn from their wicked ways, then I will hear from heaven, and I will forgive their sin and will heal their land”. (II Chronicles 7:14)

Day 3 – Pray for Christians who are enduring persecution.

Jan. 17

“Though I walk in the midst of trouble, you preserve my life. You stretch out your hand against the anger of my foes; with your right hand you save me”. (Psalms 138:7)

Day 4 – Pray for families to be strengthened in the Lord.

Jan. 18

“Be strong in the Lord and in the strength of His might. Put on the full armor of God, so that you will be able to stand firm against the schemes of the devil”. (Ephesians 6:10-11)

Day 5 – Pray for a family member or a friend who is sick.

Jan. 19

“They cried to the Lord in their trouble and he saved them from their distress. He sent out his word and healed them; he rescued them from the grave”. (Psalms 107:19-20)

Day 6 – Pray for a couple struggling in their marriage.

Jan. 20

“Bear with each other and forgive one another and forgive one another if anyone of you have a grievance against some. Forgive as the Lord forgave you. And over all these virtues, put on love, which binds them all together in perfect unity”. (Colossians 3:13-14)

Day 7 – Pray for unity in our church.

Jan. 21

“I appeal to you, dear brothers and sisters, by the authority of our Lord Jesus Christ, to live in harmony with each other. Let there be no divisions in the church. Rather, be of one mind, united in thought and purpose”. (I Corinthians 1:10 NLT)

Day 8 – Pray for Pastor Canady and the RSMBC church leadership.

Jan. 22

“If you need wisdom, ask our generous God, and he will give it to you. He will not rebuke you for asking. But when you ask him, be sure that your faith is in God alone. Do not waver, for a person with divided loyalty is as unsettled as a wave of the sea that is blown and tossed by the wind”. (James 1:5-6 NLT)

Day 9 – Pray for the ministries at RSMBC.

Jan. 23

“Whatever you do, work at it with all your heart, as working for the Lord, not for human masters, since you know that you will receive an inheritance from the Lord as a reward. It is the Lord you are serving.” (Colossians 3:23-24)

Day 10 – Pray for your neighbors.

Jan. 24

“I keep asking that the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the glorious Father, may give you the Spirit of wisdom and revelation, so that you may know him better.” (Ephesians 1:17)

Day 11 – Pray for a missionary.

Jan. 25

“Surely the righteous will never be shaken; they will be remembered forever. They will have no fear of bad news; their hearts are steadfast, trusting in the Lord”. (Psalms 112:6-7)

Day 12 – Pray for all those mourning the death of a loved one.

Jan.26

“The Lord is close to the brokenhearted and saves those who are crushed in spirit”. (Psalms 34:18)

Day 13 – Pray for people in this country to turn to God.

Jan. 27

“All the ends of the earth will remember and turn to the Lord, and all of the families of the nations will bow down before him, for dominion belongs to the Lord and he rules over the nations”. {Psalms 22:27-28)

Day 14 – Pray for government leaders.

“It is the Lord your God you must follow, and him you must revere. Keep his commands and obey him; serve him and hold fast to him”. (Deuteronomy 13:4)

Day 15 – Pray for our youth.

“But Jesus called the children to him and said, “Let the little children come to me, and do not hinder them for the kingdom of God belongs to such as these.” (Luke 18:16)

Day 16 – Pray for any unsaved family member or friend.

30

“If you declare with your mouth, ‘Jesus is Lord’ and believe in your heart that God raised him from the dead, you will be saved. For it is with your heart that you believe and are justified, and it is with your mouth that you profess your faith and are saved.” (Romans 10: 9-10)

Day 17 – Pray for someone who is battling depression.

“For the Lord your God is living among you. He is a mighty savior. He will take delight in you with gladness. With his love, he will calm all your fears. He will rejoice over you with joyful songs”. (Zephaniah 3:17 NLT)

Day 18 – Pray to curb the violence in our community. Feb. 1

“Dear friends, let us continue to love one another, for love comes from God. Anyone who loves is a child of God and knows God. But anyone who does not love does not know God, for God is love” (I John 4:7-8 NLT)

Day 19 – Pray for your heart to be obedient to the Lord. Feb.

“But whoever looks intently into the perfect law that gives freedom and continues in it—not forgetting what they have heard but doing it—they will be blessed in what they do.” (James 1:25)

Day 20 – Pray for a deeper commitment to prayer. Feb.

“Rejoice always, pray continually, give thanks in all circumstances for this is God’s will for you in Christ Jesus.” (I Thessalonians 5:16-18)

Day 21 – Pray for boldness to share the gospel with others. Feb.

“For I am not ashamed of the gospel, because it is the power of God that brings salvation to everyone who believes : first to the Jew, then to the Gentile.” (Romans 1:16)
